

DIANE GRUNEWALD MEMORIAL SCHOLARSHIP APPLICATION

The Diane Grunewald Memorial Scholarship is open to a student currently enrolled in member school district, who is receiving Deaf and/or Hard of Hearing (DHH) services and is planning to pursue post-secondary education.

For the 2016/2017 school year a \$1,000 scholarship will be awarded.

Scholarship Selection is based upon the following:

- A personal narrative essay (5 Points).
- Volunteer/community service project work (2 Points).
- Two letters of recommendation.
- Have applications pending at an accredited post-secondary institution.
- If already accepted to a post-secondary institution, submit a copy of the acceptance letter.
- Interview with scholarship committee of SWMetro Foundation board (25 Points).
- Financial need as addressed during the interview process (5 Points).
- Willingness to talk with current students receiving Deaf and/or Hard of Hearing Services during the 2017-2018 school year about your college experience.

<u>NOTE</u> - Scholarship recipients are selected on the basis of scoring as noted above. Academic record and letters of recommendation are also considered. Recipients will be selected from a pool of qualified applicants.

Selection of recipients is made by the Scholarship Committee. All applicants agree to accept the decision as final. Applicants will be notified in April. Scholarship Recipients will be invited to attend an awards breakfast on Thursday, May 25, 2017 with their families. Not all applicants to the program will be selected as recipients.

2. Letters of Recommendations Provide a minimum of two letters of recommendation from teachers, school counselors, principals, or employers. After the two minimum, additional letters of recommendations may be from church leaders, community leaders, etc.
